02 | SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Safety must be the first and constant consideration of every person who handles firearms and ammunition. The person with a firearm in his possession has an important responsibility. He/she must know how to use his/her firearm safely:

The AL 3.0/AL 3.1 Stainless Steel REVOLVERS are one of the safest type handguns, as long as it is used correctly by a competent person. Following are basic safety precautions which the user must be thoroughly familiar with when handling the revolver.

1. Always keep the firearm holstered except when drawn for a definite purpose.

2. Always check the firearm for live ammunition when picked up, drawn from the holster, handed to, or received from another person.

3. Never point the firearm at anything you do not intend to shoot.

4. Never cock the hammer of the firearm unless you are ready to immediately shoot it. Do not even insert your finger in the trigger guard until you are ready to shoot.

5. Avoid dry firing even with dummy cartridges, unless the same is performed on a regular target range or at a known inanimate target.

6. When holding the firearm that is ready to fire, be absolutely certain that it is not pointed at any part of your body or at any person within your immediate vicinity.

7. Beware of obstructions in the barrel. If, when firing, a weak or peculiar report is heard, cease firing and inspect the barrel for an obstruction. Remove stuck bullet, if any. Then check to insure there is no obstruction in barrel or chamber.

8. When a misfire or a "dud" is experienced, keep the revolver pointed at the target for at least ten seconds before inspecting the firearm; a delayed firing may occur.

9. Open the cylinder and immediately eject all cartridges.

10. When possible, wear shooting glasses and hearing protectors when firing.

11. Do not shoot at a hard surface, or water for the bullet can glance off and travel in unpredictable directions with considerable velocity.

12. Avoid drinking alcoholic beverages when handling the firearm.

03 | SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

The revolver has been designed so as to ensure its fully reliable function without any hazard for the user, provided these instructions are fulfilled. Please, take into account that the safe use of the revolver does not depend only upon its flawless mechanical functioning, but also upon personal responsibility of the user and his observing of all security principles. Every weapon can be dangerous for the user or other persons within shooting distance, if handled irresponsibly! The following security principles shall be kept to make the operation safe:

The following security principles shall be kept to make the operation safe:

- 1. Learn the operation of the revolver prior to starting its use.
- 2. Make sure the weapon is not loaded prior to handling it.
- 3. The revolver is intended for shooting in the temperature range 14 F through 122 F.
- 4. Except for self-defense always keep the gun pointed to an area where no person can be endangered.
- 5. Check the bore of the barrel prior to shooting whether it is clean and free of obstructions.
- 6. Make always sure that the target and its surrounding areas are able to receive the impact from the shots. Verify the conditions of the place and the safety of persons in its vicinity before starting to shoot. Water and very hard surfaces can cause the projectile to ricochet.
- 7. Always use the specified original ammunition of the caliber marked at the barrel.
- 8. Do not use old, dirty, damaged or re-loaded ammunition.
- 9. Never leave a loaded revolver without supervision.
- 10. Hold the revolver at the grip with your finger away of the trigger. Put the forefinger on the trigger only before the intended shot.
- 11. Only carry your gun with released striking mechanism. Do not carry your revolver in your pocket or behind your belt. Use a suitable belt-type or underarm gun holster.
- 12. Shooting any revolver is accompanied with lateral gas spray containing lead and carbon particles escaping with high velocity to the sides through the gap between the cylinder and the barrel. Hold the weapon in front of you and make sure no gas can hit persons in your vicinity.
- 13. Use safety glasses and ear protectors while shooting.
- 14. In case your shot fails, keep the gun pointed to the target for a few seconds. In such cases there may be the possibility of delayed cartridge detonation. If no shot comes out after this interval, open the cylinder and check whether there is a trace of the firing pin on the primer. If so, the ammunition seems to be defective, if not, the firing pin or the striking mechanism is likely to be the problem.

- 15. After a weak or suspicious shot unload the revolver and check the bore of the barrel for problems (the shot may be seizing).
- 16. Never use a revolver with functional failure.
- 17. Any defective part shall be replaced with an original part only. Exclusively a specialized gunsmith or repair shop or the manufacturer may carry out the repair.
- 18. No mechanical amendments of the weapon are admissible.
- 19. Keep the revolver clean. Impurities, dust and grease can cause the failure.
- Before and during the shooting abstain from alcohol, drugs, and unsuitable pharmaceuticals.
- When storing the revolver, or prior to cleaning or transporting it, make sure that all cartridge chambers are empty.
- 22. Keep the weapon and the ammunition always separated, in a dry, safe and locked place, away from children's and unauthorized persons' reach.



04 | DESCRIPTION OF THE REVOLVER

The revolver consists of a frame wherein a barrel is firmly screwed inside the shroud of the barrel and wherein the indexing mechanism of the cylinder, as well as the triggering and striking mechanisms are accommodated. The cylinder (having a central cartridge extractor) is pivoted on a crane. Front sight is a part of the barrel shroud; the frame carries a fixed or adjustable rear sight. The handle of the revolver is provided with screwed grip plates that are exchangeable (to suit the customer's wish).

The frame, shroud and cylinder are made of steel or stainless steel, according to model marking. The revolver is single- and double-action type. Pulling the trigger while double-action, the hammer gets cocked, at the same time the cylinder is indexed by one cartridge chamber and, at the last phase of the trigger movement, the cock is released,

and a shot takes place. The hammer can also be cocked by hand (single action) and the shot takes place when the trigger is actuated, overcoming a smaller resistance of the trigger than in a double action mode.





SAFETY DESIGN PRECAUTIONS

- The triggering mechanism is blocked, if the cylinder is open or if it has not fully returned to basic position.
- The cylinder cannot be open, if the hammer is cocked.
- The in-built automatic safety prevents release in case the weapon falls down, in case the finger involuntarily slips from the trigger or from the hammer (if it is tensioned by hand).



08 | AMMUNITION

This revolver is intended for self-defense, sport shooting or service use. Exclusively recommended factory loaded ammunition of the caliber marked on the weapon may be used, see following table:

09 | OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS



LOADING

Always aim with the weapon away from the body and downwards. Push the thumb piece at the left-hand side of the frame forward and at the same time push the cylinder from the right to the left, until it opens. The open cylinder is freely pivotable. Shift the cartridges into the chambers and return the cylinder. Never knock at the cylinder, as you could damage

the crane. The weapon is now loaded and prepared for shooting.



UNLOADING

Open the cylinder in the same way as for the loading operation. When the cylinder is open, push onto the shaft of the extractor. This enables you to get all cartridges out of the cylinder.



ADJUSTING OF TRIGGER STRENGTH

First of all unscrew the grip plate screw and remove the right side grip plate. Thereby a hole with eccentric pin is opened in the revolver cover. By means of a screwdriver you can turn the eccentric pin and by this means adjust the strength of the trigger spring. To lower the trigger strength turn in that direction, in which the arm of the trigger spring

(protruding on the left-hand side under the cover) is turned downwards. To increase the trigger strength turn in that direction, in which the arm of the trigger spring is turned upwards.



SHOOTING

Shooting single action:

Cock the hammer backward with the thumb of the

shooting hand, until the trigger snaps. The gun will fire by soft pull of the trigger.





If the revolver is set for shooting in single action mode with hammer

cocked, and the shooter decides not to shoot, the hammer must be decocked to its original position, in order to make the arm safe. First of all aim to a secure direction. Then use your thumb firmly pressing onto the serration part of the hammer and carefully pull the trigger with your forefinger only enough to release the hammer. Then, keeping the pressure of the thumb on the hammer, return it slowly and carefully to its original position. Release the trigger.



THE CYLINDER SHOULD NOT BE SWUNG IN AND OUT OF THE FRAME WITH EXCESSIVE FORCE, AND NEVER BY WRIST ACTION.



ADJUSTING SIGHTS

(For models with adjustable rear sight only)

The setting can be done easily with a screwdriver. Turning the setting

screw at the upper side of the rear sight clockwise makes the point of hit move up. Turning the setting screw counter-clockwise makes the point of hit move down. If you lift the sight, the central point of the hits gets lifted, if you lower the sight, the central point of the hits gets lowered.



AIMING

Align the front sight and the rear sight so as to allow the upper edge of the front sight to be aligned with the upper edge of the rear sight, the front sight being in the centre

of the sighting notch. You should see the target at the upper edge of the front sight.

CLEANING THE GUN

ATTENTION:

- 1. Make sure the revolver is unloaded prior to cleaning!
- 2. Clean immediately after the shooting (even if you may have given only one shot). After a series of shots (e.g. in case of sport shooting), clean the weapon thoroughly after every 50 shots and let the weapon cool down with opened cylinder for at least 10 minutes.
- 3. In current cases there is no need to dismantle the revolver for cleaning. If dismantling appears to be necessary for cleaning, please have it made by the manufacturer or an authorised gunsmith.
- 4. Open the cylinder and clean the revolver with a brush, with pieces of cloth and gun oil, very thoroughly in all places for removing products of shooting and lavers of cartridge particles.
- 5. If the barrel bore, the cartridge chambers and the cylinder front bear only slight signs of impurities, the nylon brush and oiled cloth pieces will do for cleaning.
- 6. If the soiling is strong, cover the dirty spots with a thick layer of gun oil with a brush and leave it for about 10 minutes, then remove the gunpowder and lead with a brass brush, continue with oiled nylon brush an rub dry with pieces of cloth. Repeat this procedure, until the last piece of cloth is clean.
- 7. Take care when cleaning, you may damage the barrel bore and the muzzle.
- 8. No vaseline, organic oil or grease may be used for lubrication and preservation.
- 9. If you intend to leave the revolver for a longer time without operating it, preserve it with gun oil.
- 10. Keep the weapon in dry environment with steady temperature, to prevent bedewing of the revolver that can result in corrosion.
- 11. Do not dismantle the weapon (except for replacing the grip plates) and do not repair it by yourselves, either; any repairs should be made by the manufacturer or by a trade mark repair shop. If these instructions are not observed, the manufacturer will not acknowledge the guarantee period.



NEVER STORE THE REVOLVER WITH A PLUG IN THE BARREL THIS WILL CONTRIBUTE TO ACCUMULATION OF MOISTURE. THE GUN SHOULD BE RE-STORED IN ROOMS WITH DRY ATMOSPHERE AND WITH THE LEAST HUMIDITY. IT SHOULD NOT BE STORED ENCASED IN LEATHER OR ANYTHING THAT WILL ATTRACT AND HOLD MOISTURE, CAUSING IT TO RUST.

STORAGE AND TRANSPORTATION

The external parts must be coated with an anti-rust oil or grease to prevent moisture causing the parts to rust and malfunction. Before usage, the revolver must be cleaned and wiped dry again as discussed previously.
